Butler Street Lofts is a living, work, and events space in a historic building in the heart of Lawrenceville. The building, designed in 1912 by Robert Trimble, was originally the Lawrenceville YMCA, and in 1928 it became The Boys' and Girls' Club. The building was recently restored by Crow Hill Development, a company based in Brooklyn that specializes in the adaptive reuse of historic buildings. Butler Street Lofts is their first project in Pittsburgh.

Eowyn Mays is an independent curator based in Washington, D.C. Mays earned a B.A. in art history from Tulane University and an M.A. in art history from the University of Maryland where she specialized in American and contemporary art.
